#### **FOREWORD**



#### PRODUCER'S NOTES

#### TRIAL BY JURY

The libretto of "Trial by Jury" was originally written by Gilbert as an article for "FUN" (a weekly magazine, the forerunner of "PUNCH").

However, the theme of the article was later elaborated, taking on the guise of a libretto. It came to the notice of an impresario who suggested Sullivan as being the perfect composer for it.

Had a 'curtain raiser' not been needed, "Trial by Jury" would not have been composed by Sullivan, Richard D'Oyly Carte would not have produced it, and the world might never have received Gilbert and Sullivan Operas. For it was the curtain raiser's great success that caused it to become the main piece of the evening and which gave Carte the opportunity to bring the three of them together for many years.

#### H.M.S. PINAFORE

In this gay piece of nautical nonsense Gilbert has directed the arrows of satire towards two aspects of life in the Royal Navy. The first is interference in Service matter by the civilian in uniform, in the person of the First Lord of the Admiralty, the second is the unsurmountable barrier between the upper and lower decks. This is underlined by Josephine's love for a "common sailor" and Little Buttercup's feelings for the Captain.


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
