it was lost.

Tererce Rees bought Sullivan's manuscriptin an auction and produced vocal scores and orchestral parts.

The first 20th century production was in 1971 by Fulham Light Operatic
Society. Recently it has been broadcat
by the B.B.C. with Ian Wallace and
John Boulter in the cast.
