

Extension Arrangement Plan 4

DLA 102

This arrangement enables you to make and receive calls at several different points in a house or an office, without paying for a telephone instrument at each one.

The line is connected to sockets, and a tablephone or Trimphone, with plug, can be moved from point to point, as required.



How it operates

The exchange line is connected to any required number of sockets which we fit where you need them in the house or office.

Up to five telephones, each with plug, can be used in the sockets, and any one of them can be used to make or answer calls.

A main bell is provided, and the portable telephones also have bells, or tone-callers when Trimphones are used.

Facilities

The telephones can be moved from socket to socket, as required, except during a call. For example, a telephone can be carried upstairs for use during the night.

Calls can be made or received at any point.

An incoming call always rings the main bell, any bell in a telephone that is plugged in at the time, and any additional bells.

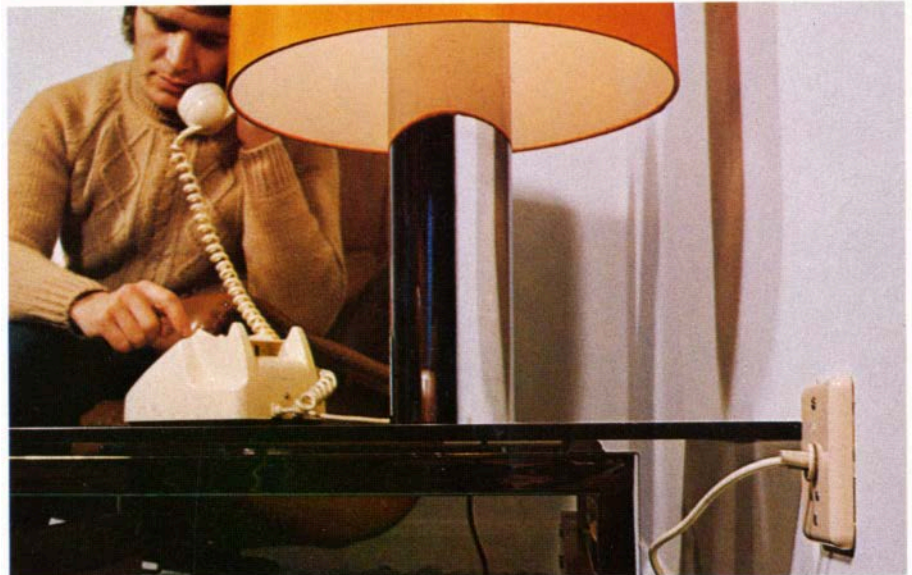
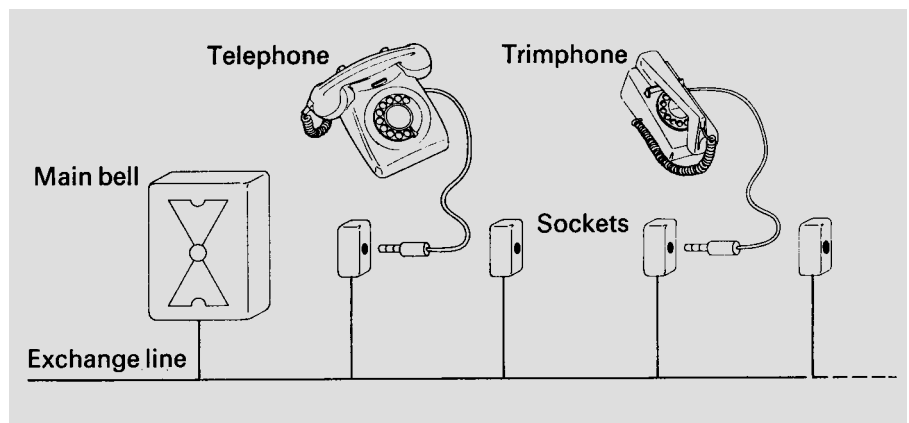
Certain combinations of this arrangement are possible with plans 1, 1A (see DLA 100) and the extension of plans 107, 107A (see DLA 103).

General information

The tablephones are available in concord blue, topaz yellow, lacquer red, two-tone green, two-tone grey, ivory, and black.

Trimphones, in a choice of three colours, blue, green and grey, can be provided for a small increase in rental; a change of instrument charge may also be payable.

The telephone cords, plugs, and sockets can be provided in grey or ivory, and the sockets, usually surface-mounted, can be flush-mounted if conduit and boxes have been provided where necessary.
