An extension arrangement suitable for those who have their calls filtered by a secretary, but who want secrecy on their own telephone.



The system consists of a main telephone with three press buttons and an extra bell; and one internal extension telephone with one press button and an extra bell.

How it operates

Incoming calls normally ring the bell in both the main and extension telephone. Calls can be answered at either point.

The bell in the main telephone can be cut off by pressing the button marked "ON/OFF". Incoming calls then ring the extension telephone bell only.

The main telephone user can call the extension telephone by pressing the button marked "EXTN" which rings the extra bell fitted near the extension telephone.

The extension can be cut off at any time by operating the button marked "1" on the main telephone. The extension can be reconnected by pressing the button marked "EXTN".

If the extension telephone is left cut off it is automatically reconnected when the handset on the main telephone is replaced.

The extension user can call the main telephone by pressing the button, which rings the extra bell fitted near the telephone.

Exchange calls can be made direct from either telephone.

Speech between the main and extension telephones should only be attempted when transferring an existing call. This speech will be heard by the outside caller.

General information

The arrangement can be provided on an exchange line or a PBX extension.

The main telephone can be provided in black, two-tone grey, and ivory. The extension telephone can be provided from the full range of colours.
