The charges shown in this leaflet are correct as at 1st October 1972.

The charges may be revised subsequently by the Post Office.

We do our best to supply our customers with the apparatus they ask for, but we may have to provide apparatus which does not accord exactly with the descriptions and illustrations in the leaflets mentioned.

From 1st April 1973 value added tax will be payable for telecommunications services and will be added to the total of charges on customers' bills.
