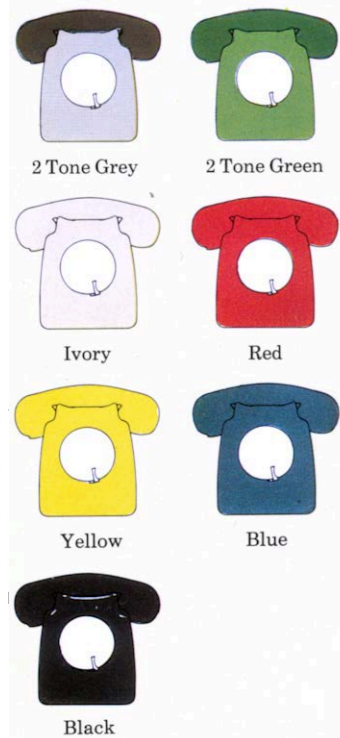
This leaflet describes the standard and premium range of telephones which give customers a wider choice of telephone for the home or office and in some cases new and improved facilities.

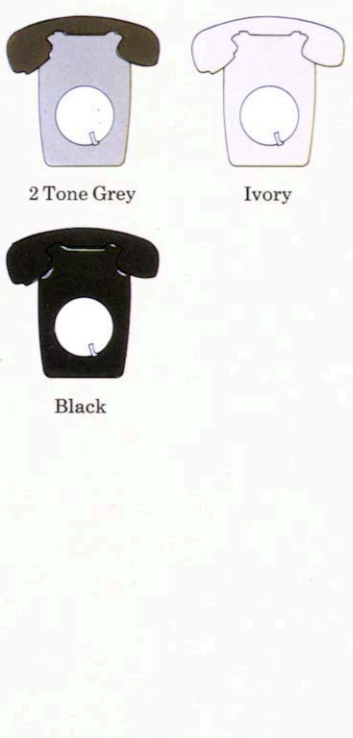
The tablephone comes in seven colours:

These space-saving phones are available in three colours:

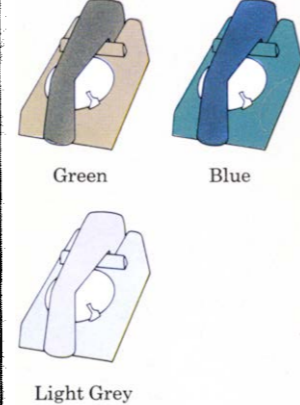

Trimphones



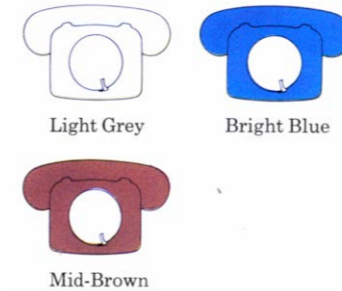
A small lightweight phone, with special features, to add style to your home. Not only does it have a different shape, it also makes a different noise – an intermittent warble – and has a dial that glows in the dark.



The Compact telephone



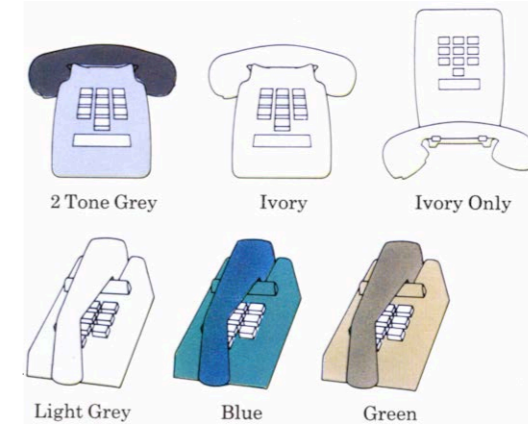
Available as a table or wall-mounted telephone the 'Compact' has a separate bell-unit with an adjustable volume control.



Press-button telephones



A modern, efficient, easier-to-use phone at reasonable extra cost. Press-button Trimphones and table and wall-mounted versions of Press-button Telephones are now available.



Note: Press-button telephones
Due to the gradual introduction of new equipment throughout the British Telecom Public Telephone System, customers ordering press-button telephones may be provided with either ten or twelve button models, and in some instances a new dial tone.

Users of the twelve button models will also hear a 'confidence tone' on depression of the press-buttons. This

tone varies between press-buttons, simply informing the user that the telephone is functioning correctly.

Initially there will be no new facilities provided with the additional buttons, but their introduction is the groundwork for future new customer services. Because of this, no choice will be offered, and there will be no difference in charges.

Pendant telephone



This grey telephone handset suitable for fitting in the knee-hole of a desk or on a wall to save space, can be provided for a small additional rental. A separate matching drawer type dial unit can be fitted beneath the edge of the desk. The bell is wall-mounted in a grey case and may be placed in any convenient position.

Weatherphone



A wall-mounted telephone contained in a grey metal case, can be provided for use at outdoor locations. It may be used on exchange lines and switchboard extensions and associated with some plan arrangements. The hinged door is finished in blue and can be provided with a lock if required. The telephone, which contains an integral bell, may be fitted on a wall or to a pole. The case measures 318mm by 145mm by 168mm, and the total weight is 5 kg.

Explosive atmosphere telephone



These telephones have been designed for use in locations where an accumulation of certain types of gases could create a possible risk of explosion. They are fully described in descriptive leaflet DLE 501.
