Sceptre 100 is fitted with the new standard British Telecom plug, and is available in two colour combinations;

When in use, the telephone is powered from the exchange line; when not in use, the memory and other facilities are maintained by power from 4 alkaline MN 1500 batteries. The batteries have an estimated life of 1 year and are available from most electrical goods retailers.
