The new Ambassador telephone is not only a most attractive design but it includes facilities and features not found in conventional models.

Designed for both business and residential use, the Ambassador is easy to use and is flexible in operation.

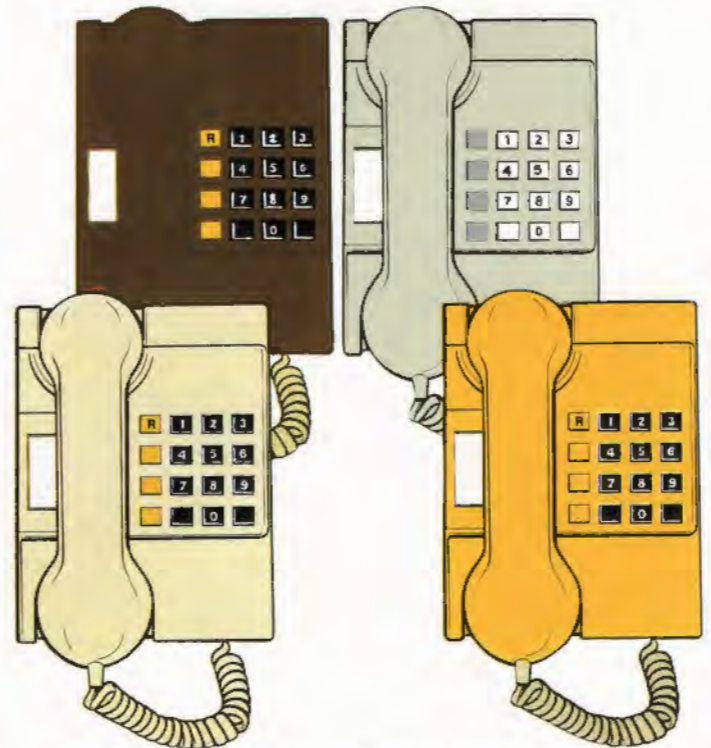
The basic self-contained telephone, which is available in dial or press-button versions, is the first of a new family of telephones, designed for straightforward situations such as exchange lines, extra socket answering points and switchboard extensions. It is not suitable for shared service working.

Versatile in application the Ambassador can be free-standing or casually/permanently wall-mounted. MF press-button versions are available for exchange or PABX working.

In the casual wall-mounted position the Ambassador can be lifted off the bracket for use elsewhere, using the carrying recess under the handset.



The Ambassador is available in 4 colours, Dark Brown, Mid Grey, Stone or Yellow. (The M.F. press-button version is not available in yellow). Your local British Telecom Sales Office will be pleased to give you details.



Due to the gradual introduction of new equipment in telephone exchanges, customers ordering press-button telephones may be provided with 16 button models. Initially there will be no new facilities provided with the extra buttons but their introduction is the base for future new services.

Beneath the handset is a flip-up tray, under which can be noted useful telephone numbers. There is also a bell volume control with an off position.

As an aid to siting the telephone, the line cord entry to the base can be from the rear or either side.
