Osprey answering/recording machine puts your telephone calls on ice for you to handle later.



Osprey answers every incoming call with your own recorded message. Making the recording is simple with Osprey. You select the RECORD mode, press the start button and speak to the built-in microphone. Touch the button again, switch to AUTO ANSWER and every caller will get your message.



Osprey records callers' messages for you to listen to later. To hear the messages you simply rewind the tape and listen to them through the loudspeaker, or use the plug-in earphone for privacy. By controlling the speed of the tape you can store more incoming messages. This facility also lets you match the tape speed to an office dictation system. Osprey lets you monitor incoming calls whilst the recording is taking place and you can intercept the caller at any time by picking up the telephone handset. The loudspeaker volume can be easily adjusted.



Osprey takes note of your telephone conversations when required by recording at the touch of a button. You can then replay the conversation, store it or erase it in the usual way



Osprey 'sits in' on meetings or discussions as a recorder, using the highly-sensitive built-in electronic microphone or a more selective microphone plugged into the socket provided. Here again you can match the tape speed to your office dictation equipment.

Osprey, so much more than an answering machine. It's your 24-hour message centre.
