• Local, STD and international calls can all be dialled easily.




- It accepts 2p, 5p, 10p and 50p coins via a single coin-slot, and up to 4 coins can be inserted in advance-making STD and dialled international calls easier!
- The user is warned of 'credit expiry' by a flashing lamp and a warning tone.
- Any unused coins are returned at the end of a call.

- A 'cash-box full' sensor helps to prevent jammed coin slots.
- Full incoming-call service is available, except for inland Transfer Charge Calls.

Calls to the operator services (except for 999 calls) are not possible in the payphone mode, but: When the Payphone 100 is switched to ordinary telephone





use, full services, including operator service and all incoming calls, are available. Calls may be made without inserting coins.


Alternatively, the Payphone 100 can be simply and permanently a payphone.

It is available in brown, stone, or yellow-easy to spot in a crowded room-all with a black base. It can be provided with an extension telephone – please consult your British Telecom Sales Office.

The payphone can, if necessary, be fixed to the counter. Even so, because of its light, attractive styling, it is recommended that the Payphone 100 is not left in unsupervised locations. But that still leaves thousands of situations simply made for the Payphone 100! The Payphone 100 will be available in London from December 1982 and will become available in the rest of the country during 1983.


